From the Corporation President

It Has Been Quite a Year!

It has been quite a year. One year ago, on April 6, 2002, a large contingent of Alpha Zeta Delta alumni gathered in Champaign to tour the vacant fraternity house at 110 East Armory that the Alumni Corporation Board was considering purchasing to serve as a permanent Lodge for the Alpha. Following the tour, we held a special meeting of the Alumni Corporation to discuss our options, and the alumni present voted unanimously in favor of pursuing the purchase of the building and embarking on a capital fund-raising campaign to provide the necessary funds.

After extensive negotiation, we finally reached an agreement in June 2002 to buy the Lodge on a two-year installment plan with a balloon payment in June 2004. We also hired Gilchrist Alumni Management Associates to conduct the capital fundraising campaign. Planning and preparation for the campaign is nearing completion, and more information on the details of the campaign will be forthcoming soon. Suffice it to say that the success of the campaign will be dependent on volunteer efforts of dozens of alumni and the generous financial contributions of all of us.

We are now nearing the end of the first school year in the new Lodge, and the Alpha is thriving in her new home. The entire undergraduate brotherhood and several alumni worked tirelessly last summer to get the Lodge ready for occupancy, and the transformation was simply amazing. The pace hasn't let up as the Brothers and Pledges have continued to toil to make the Lodge into a home while still focusing on their studies, jobs, recruitment, intramurals, and social calendar. The quality of new members continues to be among the highest on campus, and it shows in a spirit of all-around excellence.

Yes, it has been quite a year.

I strongly encourage you to take a look at the calendar of events in this issue of the Parthenon and to make every effort to attend one or more alumni events in the coming months. If you live in the Chicago area (or even if you don't), I highly recommend the annual Founders Day banquet at the Edgewood Country Club. This event has really taken off in popularity, and once again you



can look forward to good food, good company, special presentations, an engaging keynote speaker, and dancing in an elegant setting. If you're athletically inclined and/or have children, don't miss the annual Summer Picnic and Softball Challenge (location to be announced). Besides the annual alumni-active softball game, there will be a play-

On December 26th, 2002, my life changed forever. Around 10 in the morning, I received the phone call that no one wants to hear. I heard that on the previous day, my best friend had died. Not only did I lose my best friend, but I lost the person that I've lived with for three years, the person I shared a room with, the leader of my pledge class, and the one Lodger who I trusted the most. However, most of all, I lost my brother.

For those who did not really know TJ, he was a model Lodger and a model human being. He loved his family, especially his father, who would come frequently to visit from St. Louis. TJ also spent countless hours on the phone with his little brother Andrew, who was living with his mother up in St. Charles.

TJ was definitely a person who was full of life. He loved his family, his friends, his faith, his sports, and his Lodge. I think he definitely loved sports the most. I can barely remember a day where we did not wake up to ESPN and spend breakfast talking about how this was the Cardinals' year and how the Illini were going to the Final Four at the end of the season. TJ played in any intramural sport he could find or make time for. He was an avid player of football, he helped lead our soccer team to the finals, he played on our softball team, and was even the lead goal scorer on our roller hockey "B" team. He was involved in everything he could around campus. He was part of the Technology and Management program, Alpha Kappa Psi business fraternity; he worked for the Illini Media Company, and even the University Dining Service. He loved to travel, spending time with Brother Parks in England and Ireland, spend a week or two in Belgium with classmates, as well as not forgetting to send me e-mail from Times Square in NYC just to say hello.

TJ had many ambitious dreams as well. He was highly motivated by politics and was planning on attending law school after his undergraduate time at U of I. I remember laughing with him about how he was going to be my lawyer if I could be his doctor, and we could watch each other's backs. We even joked about how if he was elected President of the United States, I could get to be his Surgeon General. Living with him was one of the defining moments in my collegiate life. Back in the temporary Lodge at 311 E Armory, you could usually find TJ in our

room working on homework and projects, listening to music, watching a movie, or watching the big game. Our room was somehow always messy, especially during test time. I hate to admit this, but there were points when you couldn't see the floor around midterms. When living with TJ, I learned that excellence doesn't have enough time for cleaning up.

TJ had many of the qualities that make someone a great person and a great friend. He was always friendly no matter what he was working on. Anytime you wanted to go in his room and talk, TJ would nearly drop everything he was doing and chat for a while. TJ was also very easy to approach, and he had a certain way of making you feel comfortable around him. He was always very passionate about everything he talked about. He could go on for hours about religion, foreign policy, school, sports, and how in ten years he would have his Porsche.

TJ also loved to talk about the Lodge. From what I had observed, the Lodge meant everything to TJ. The intensity and determination he possessed was evident from the first pledge meeting we attended. From that first day, TJ vowed to become the president that would lead Alpha Zeta Delta to greatness. I remember on more than one occasion we had spent all night discussing plans for the Lodge, only stopping when we wearily had to go to class. I can only describe TJ's vision as incredible. There are so many ideas that he had, and the Alpha can only be improved if we follow through on those thoughts. When he finally was elected as president of the Alpha, that determination was once again fired up, as his dreams were about to be accomplished. He would not rest until we received the Thayer Trophy from the next National Convention. Unfortunately, TJ did not get to realize that dream, as he was taken from us prematurely. I can only hope that future generations of brothers will take to heart everything that TJ stood for as a friend, a brother, a gentleman, and the great person that we should all strive to be. Brother, you will be greatly missed and may you be remembered always at gatherings of Alpha Zeta Delta of Chi Psi as well as forever in our hearts.

It was the year 1940 when I was a pledge at Alpha Zeta Delta of Chi Psi. At that time, George's dad, Larry Dickson, became active in Alpha Zeta Delta of Chi Psi as a former member of Chi Beta Fraternity, which merged with Chi Psi that year. During the next three years that George was in high school, Larry would bring George to Illini football games. Larry would also, as president of the Zeta Delta alumni, preside over the annual alumni meeting at Homecoming.

Then, in 1943-46 while I was in the Navy, George was initiated into Chi Psi (in 1945), and he was in the army soon after that. Back at the University of Illinois in 1946 after World War II, George and I became the best of friends, and graduated in 1949.

A few years after that, George married Ann. They had twin daughters, Nancy and Susan, then Janet and Sandy. I watched the four daughters grow up, seeing them at corn roasts, anniversaries, college (three of the girls went to the University of Illinois, and Sandy went to Eastern Illinois at Charleston). I attended their weddings, and now there are ten grandchildren in the family. I am their adopted Uncle Frank.

During this time, George was an active Alpha Zeta Delta Alumni president a couple of times. Under difficult times, the Lodge on Second Street was sold, and George took over as president of the Alpha Zeta Delta Educational Foundation, and held meetings at his office every couple of months. As always, George was there to help. When funds were not available, George would purchase computers and other items that were needed at Zeta Delta.

I will always miss you, George, but I know you are there, somewhere, helping us out.
