Deal Reached to Purchase Lodge *Capital Campaign Launched to Fund New Building*

After 25 years of wandering on the University of Illinois campus, the Alumni Corporation is excited

to announce that we have reached a deal to purchase a permanent Lodge for Alpha Zeta Delta.

The new permanent Lodge will be the current Delta Zeta sorority house located at 710 West Ohio Street in Urbana. Before I tell you what we will need from you to ensure our success, let me take a minute to explain how this deal came about.

An Unforeseen Opportunity

The deal came together quickly and unexpectedly. Although the Corporation had been laying the groundwork for a capital campaign for some time, our plan was focused on purchasing the current Lodge at 606 West Ohio Street. The undergraduate Brothers are thriving in the current Lodge, but the location is not ideal and the building requires several expensive repairs. So even with our tentative plan in place, we kept an eye out for other available properties on campus.

Last March a real estate broker contacted the Corporation about purchasing the Delta Zeta sorority house, as they are building a new home in Champaign. Board members conducted a walk-through that same month. The building was impressive, and the location is more desirable than that of the current Lodge. At the time, the sorority's asking price was a firm \$1.8M. This was well above our price range and we walked away without much thought.

In early September, we reached out to Delta Zeta and were surprised to learn that the house had not yet sold. We successfully negotiated a significant price reduction and reached an agreement to purchase the house for \$1.65M. The closing is scheduled for May 31, 2019.

Why Delta Zeta?

Words cannot adequately convey the pristine condition of the Delta Zeta house. Although most sorority houses on campus are kept in great shape, this is especially true for Delta Zeta. Over the last 13 years, the sorority made numerous major (and expensive) improvements to their building, upgrading everything from the cosmetics to the infrastructure. For example, within the last 3 years the building was tuck-pointed, its kitchen was completely renovated, the parking lot was replaced, and the landscaping was overhauled.

Before reaching our agreement with Delta Zeta, we had a property management company inspect both properties to determine how much it would cost to bring the current Lodge up to the standard of the Delta Zeta house. Upon receiving those inspection reports, our decision was clear. While the current Lodge presents plenty of potential, we would need to spend over \$500,000 (on top of the purchase price) to bring it up to the standard we want for our permanent home. In contrast, the Delta Zeta house is turnkey, and we can focus on

growing our Alpha, not repairing our bricks and mortar.

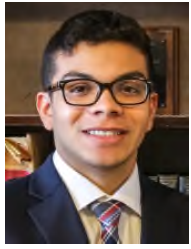
Capital Campaign Begins Now

I recently met with the undergraduates and their enthusiasm for this deal is contagious. They recognize the opportunity this presents and have committed to ensuring its success. For example, as of this newsletter over 90% of the undergraduates have committed

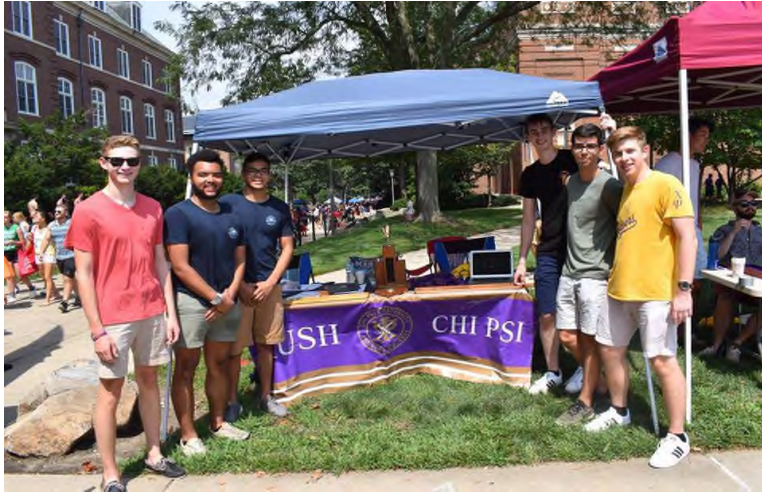
The Initiation banquet was great time to welcome 10 new brothers into the

to living in the new Lodge next year. On the alumni side, our goal is straightforward – we need to raise at least \$500,000 before May 1, 2019 to put towards the down payment on the house. While we may be able to obtain additional funds from Zeta Delta's Educational Trust fund (established with the proceeds from the sale of the Lodge at 912 S. Second), the bulk of the purchase money must come from alumni gifts.

The name of our campaign is "Restoring Excellence: The Zeta Delta Lodge Campaign" because our goal is not simply to purchase a building but to restore Zeta Delta's standing as one of the top fraternities on campus and one of the top Alphas in Chi Psi. That cannot be done without a permanent Lodge, and the time has come for all alumni to band together and give our Alpha the permanent home she deserves.

The Capital Campaign will be conducted in two phases. **Phase 1** must be completed by May 1, 2019 and *must* raise at least \$500,000 for the down payment for the Lodge. This will be accomplished through a combination of large gifts from major donors and smaller gifts from anyone who is able to donate to the campaign on or before May 1, 2019.

After the new Lodge is purchased, **Phase 2** of the Campaign will begin. It will operate over a multi-year timeline and will raise additional funds to reduce the amount of the Lodge's mortgage, create a reserve fund for maintenance and future repairs, and replenish Zeta Delta's Educational Trust fund so the Alpha's scholarship programs and educational grants may continue.

We are happy to announce that Paul Parks, ZΔ '03, is our Capital Campaign Committee Chairman and W. David Romsos, ZΔ '65, will serve as Director of Development. Together they have done an outstanding job in the past several months reaching out to our alumni Brothers and spreading the good news about the future of our Alpha. We are

also happy to announce that Christopher W. Riehs, ZΔ '90, has agreed to serve as Treasurer of the Capital Campaign. The other 10 members of the Capital Campaign Committee include members of the alumni board and other interested alumni of each generation. Needless to say, the Capital Campaign committee believes we will achieve our goal – and have put their money where their mouths are, pledging over \$95,000 towards **Phase 1** of the campaign.

How You Can Help

We all need to come together to make this deal happen. Statistics show that generally only 25% of an organization's



members contribute to a capital campaign. We can – and must – do better. For this campaign to succeed – and for our Alpha to finally obtain a permanent home – we will need that number to be significantly higher. So the most important things you can do to ensure our success are: 1.) make a gift to the Campaign; 2.) volunteer your expertise to our fundraising efforts; and 3.) spread the word.

We are actively searching out five (5) Brothers who have the ability and willingness to make a \$50,000 gift, and ten (10) Brother to donate \$25,000 to the cause. However, any amount that you can give will greatly aid our efforts, so

please consider participating in **Phase 1**, **Phase 2**, or (if you are able) **both**. However, *without a successful Phase 1, there is no permanent Lodge*.

We are also in need of volunteers to serve as class leaders or regional chairmen for the Campaign. If you are interested in taking a more active role, please contact me (mrhess78@gmail.com) or Paul Parks (poparks2@yahoo.com) and let us know.

Finally, discuss our plans with Brothers you are in touch with and let them know about the developments in Urbana. Although we have stepped up our alumni outreach efforts these past couple of years, there are still many Brothers we are unable to reach. Pick up the phone, send an email, talk to them about these exciting developments and invite them to attend an event or make a gift.

The opportunity to purchase the Delta Zeta house is perfect for us and we cannot let it get away. But we need your help, Brother.

The new, permanent Lodge will impress the undergraduates, future Brothers and their families, and help the Alpha grow – both in terms of size and their level of achievement. A new, permanent Lodge has benefits for you as an alumnus as well – it will be a place where you can reconnect with old friends, relive fond memories, impress your family, and allow your legacy of Brotherhood to continue.

We are on the cusp of solidifying Chi Psi's second century at the University of Illinois. Our Alpha has been on campus for 106 years and we want to make sure it is strong and prominent – a beacon of Brotherhood and Excellence for generations to come. By participating in the Capital Campaign – with your money, with your time, with your enthusiasm – you will be someone that future Chi Psis will celebrate at Zeta Delta's 200th Anniversary Gathering.

The opportunity is right. The time has come. Together we will achieve the dream and leave a lasting legacy for the future!

Zeta Delta's #1 When it Last Won a Thayer Trophy Reflects on his Time in the Lodge

Ever since the old Lodge was sold in January, 1994, the undergraduates who passed through the doors of Alpha Zeta Delta have all enjoyed a similar Chi Psi experience.

Many words have been used to describe the Zeta Delta experience of the last 25 years. It has been that of a "growing" Brotherhood; a "rebuilding" Alpha; one based on the "promise" of a better tomorrow. The experience has been one highlighted by the formation of close friendships and shared values, to be sure. Brothers have universally described Zeta Delta as being comprised of Brothers who are "down to earth" and "genuine," unlike the fraternity stereotype. And there have been times when the Alpha has enjoyed modest success (such as when it won the Founders Trophy in 1995 and 2000).

But for the past 25 years, the story of Zeta Delta has been a mediocre one. It

throughout the Chi Psi world. The Alpha's accomplishments were recognized in 1953 when Zeta Delta was last awarded the Thayer Trophy at Chi Psi's Annual Convention. Zeta Delta also took home the Goodbody Trophy for the third year in a row that year, which is awarded to the top performing Alpha scholastically.

Tom Humphris was the #1 that year. He joined Chi Psi in the Fall, 1949 semester, and remembers those years fondly to this day.

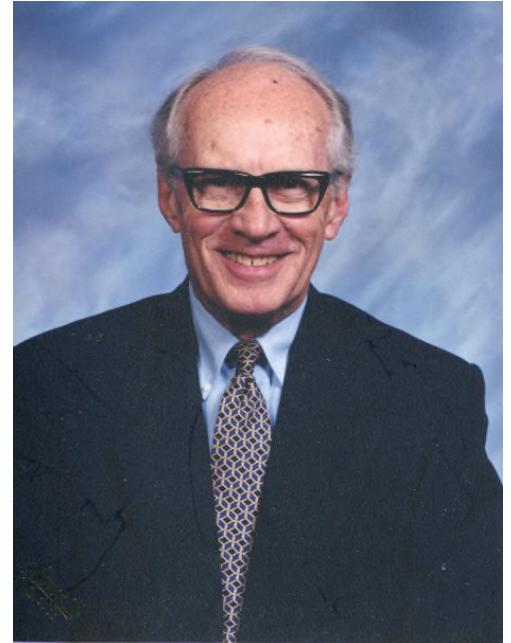
"Back in those days there were summer rushing gatherings for some fraternities, plus formal rushing was a week before classes started. The Brothers of Chi Psi were the most impressive and down to earth during all of the rushing activity."

Humphris, a marketing major, was not above pulling off a good prank on his fellow Brothers.

"One of the pledge duties back in the '50's was waking up brothers on certain days. I had a reputation for being rather difficult to wake up on Saturday mornings, so Pledge Dave Lawrence and I concocted a scheme. At breakfast, Dave and I started getting into an argument about my difficulty of getting up. Dave had a starter gun with his activity with the university track team, so he pulled out the gun and shot me. I immediately fell to the floor feigning being wounded. Naturally, everyone was in a state of shock until Dave and I started laughing."

Many Zeta Delta Brothers were involved on campus during Humphris' years and many held leadership positions in University organizations. The Alpha's strength and high level of achievement, both academically and on campus, resulted in Champaign being chosen to host the 111th Annual Convention. Brother Humphris represented the Alpha well at that Convention.

"During the 1952 National Convention of Chi Psi in Champaign, I was fortunate enough to have Trev Roberts, the #1 from Epsilon Delta as my roommate. As events unfolded, our bathtub became



the refreshment center for a lot of Brothers. It was filled with ice for the beverages that were available. I can't remember where Trev and I had to take a shower. Traffic tidiness was a problem, so it resulted in both Trev and I receiving a letter from Slip Slifer, National Secretary, after the convention requesting a donation from each of us for the unfortunate room damage."

After graduating from the School of Business, Humphris spent two years serving in the United States Air Force. He then took a job with Amerock Corporation in Rockford, Illinois, which was a leading cabinet hardware and specialty hardware family-owned business. Going to work for Amerock was "one of the best and luckiest decisions I ever made."

"It was a family-owned business with probably 1,200 employees, growing rapidly in consumer and industrial hardware products. My career path included production control, inside sales, Industrial Sales Manager, and Director of Industrial Products Marketing.

The experience gained with that fine company gave me the background to start T.L. Humphris Company in 1969 which eventually grew to Humphris, Kiefer & Associates as it is today."

Today, Brother Humphris serves Humphris, Kiefer & Associates as a manufacturer's representative stationed in Rockford, Illinois with an office in Hoffman Estates covering parts of Wis-
